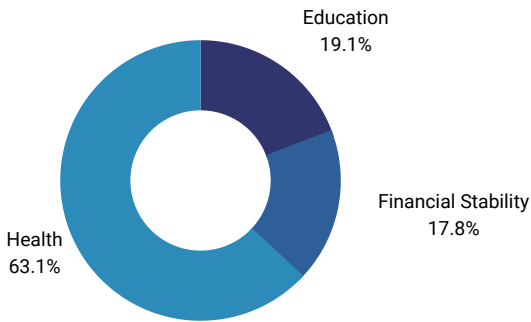
United Way has been committed to making real impact in Shenandoah County since 1990!

Impact Grant Funding:

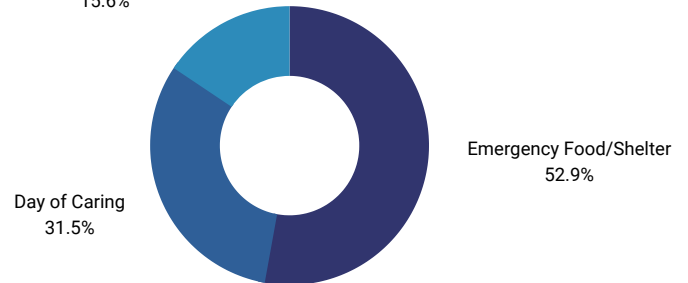

Emergency Food/Shelter

\$50,277

Education

- \$40,855 – Community Care and Learning Center – to provide tuition assistance for working families and establish an infant room at the center
- \$19,375 – Big Brothers Big Sisters of Harrisonburg Rockingham County – to support the expansion of school-based mentoring programs in Shenandoah County
- \$10,000 - Staunton-Augusta Family YMCA – to support the after-school program for middle school students in Shenandoah County
- \$6,875 - Reading Road Show – Gus Bus – to provide learning activities, food bags and books to children

Financial Stability

- \$36,000 – Shenandoah Alliance for Shelter – to support the Centralized Housing Intake program to connect callers experiencing a housing crisis
- \$30,000 – Family Promise of Shenandoah County – to provide support services to homeless families as they work toward stability
- \$3,000 – Response, Inc –to assist domestic and sexual violence survivors with securing housing, transportation, childcare and other resources
- \$2,500 - Blue Ridge Habitat for Humanity – to support critical home repairs in Shenandoah County

Health

- \$120,360 – Shenandoah Free Clinic – to provide counseling for students in Shenandoah County schools
- \$64,000 – Shenandoah Dental Clinic – to provide regular dental care to uninsured children and adults
- \$35,000 - Child Safe Center CAC – to provide child abuse assessments, trauma screenings and mental health treatment services to abuse victims
- \$29,000 – Healthy Families Shenandoah and Page County – to provide free in-home health and wellness screenings and education to families
- \$5,765 - Brain Injury Connections - to provide wrap-around services for brain-injured clients and their families who live in Shenandoah County

COVID-19 Relief and ALICE Emergency Funds

- \$2,000 - ALICE Emergency Fund - to support 4 Shenandoah County families with needs like car repairs and childcare to help them move from crisis to stability
- \$5,000 – Compassion Cupboard – food and groceries to support the pantry
- \$2,500 – Family Promise of Shenandoah County – H.O.P.E. Food Pantry support
- \$1,700 – Faithworks – rent and mortgage assistance
- \$1,650 – Community Care and Learning Center – supplies and registration costs
- \$1,000 – Brain Injury Connections – food and gift cards to support families
- \$1,000 – Highland Food Pantry – utility bill assistance for Shenandoah County residents

Emergency Food/Shelter

Faithworks - \$50,277 to provide rent and mortgage assistance in 2021
